### **Publication Dates of L.C. Results, CAO Offers & Appeals to Change for 2019**

Following on from the High Court action taken by Leaving Certificate student Rebecca Carter in August of this year and the recommendation of the court to the SEC to review the entire Leaving Certificate Appeals procedure and timeline, it is reported that changes have been agreed by the SEC in conjunction with the CAO and all the Higher Education Authorities. This will see the Leaving Certificate results 2019 issued a day earlier, Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> August, CAO offers issued on Friday 16<sup>th</sup> August and decisions on Leaving Certificate Appeals communicated to students between 18<sup>th</sup> – 20<sup>th</sup> August, almost three weeks earlier than the current Appeals system.

I believe these changes will be welcomed by students and parents, especially given that students had to wait five full days from the issuing of results to CAO offers under the old system whereas now they receive them within three days. In addition students who are upgraded following a subject appeal and are entitled to a new college offer will have missed less lecture time. ### **CAO 2019**

A reminder to all 6<sup>th</sup> year students that the CAO Application Cycle for 2019 opens on Monday 5<sup>th</sup> November at 12 noon. All students received their CAO Handbook back in early September. It is often the case that since its publication in the summer many changes can follow relating to new courses being sanctioned, changes to existing course titles as well as courses that may be withdrawn by colleges. Please note that the discounted application fee of €30 applies up to 20<sup>th</sup> January (5.15 p.m.) Applications after this date and up to the 1<sup>st</sup> February cost €45. With the mock exams on the horizon on our return after Christmas I would advise all students to set up their CAO Accounts before we break on 21<sup>st</sup> December.
