### Transition Year

TY students are busy preparing for their mock interviews on Friday 10<sup>th</sup> May. A number of local business volunteers from Dundalk Chamber of Commerce will be in the school to put the students through their paces. Students will receive feedback via the Interview Assessment Form which will be posted along with their Module 3 & 4 reports in June.

TY's have also submitted their Subject Choice Forms for 5<sup>th</sup> Year. It should be noted that if a student is unsure about one of their chosen options then they should not purchase the text book, rather wait until the start of the new school year and sit in on a few classes in the subject before going to the expense of buying the required texts and materials.

### 5<sup>th</sup> Year

While the summer holidays provide valuable downtime for students the long break can also provide an opportunity to get some groundwork done before sixth year gets underway. Examples of this include compiling web-based research/documents that will form part of your Agricultural Science project. Students contemplating applying to courses in UK or European Universities could start identifying colleges, course information including entry requirements and application timelines.

A key component of the application to the U.K. colleges requires students to draft a personal statement. This has already been covered in class and students are encouraged to make a start on this. Visit
